PUBLIC GARDENS, GARDENING, AGRICULTURE: TOWARDS MORE SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES

Urban gardening is a growing mode of social engagement into creative/productive use of the public space worldwide. Urban gardens have a very long history, as growing food in or around the city was common practice before industrialization and urban sprawls of the last two centuries. Even in recent times, however, people have kept practicing urban farming in a variety of forms, as a means to subsistence, to social and generational cohesion, to local/sustainable food production. At the same time, Urban Agriculture has become a growing field of interdisciplinary studies between the social and the natural sciences. This workshop aims to suggest the possibility of seeing urban gardening from one additional perspective, that is: as a form of 'popular art/craft'. Urban farming is a non-industrial activity based on personal, often vernacular, crafting skills. It is a creative way of using nature as row material and as a source of inspiration. Designing horticulture, bee-haves and little scale irrigation, remodelling abandoned urban plots, turning waste into cultivated green areas, are all forms of creative engagement with/reinvention of the public space. Moreover, people often engage with these activities in un-planned ways, as forms of individual and collective re-connection with nature, thus also re-inventing social connection at the community level.

Starting from a reflection on the above general aspects of urban gardening as 'popular art/craft', the workshop will put into dialogue several experiences from different parts of the world, aiming at stimulating a debate on the multiple ways in which those experiences can foster socially and ecologically sustainable communities.

The round table will be followed by a guided tour to the community permaculture experiments at the University of Coimbra's Botanical Garden.
