### **(July 11) Day 1 - Envisioning transformations and the pluriverse**

*Getting to know each other, building trust and conviviality, clarifying the expectations. Setting the context: the Climate Crisis and its systemic roots, the Anthropocene and its critiques (Racial Capitalocene et al.); as well as transformative proposals for new eco-social horizons, drawing on post-capitalist, degrowth, intersectional feminist, afro/indigenous and decolonial imaginaries.*

**(July 12) Day 2 - Eco-social justice and post-extractive futures**

*Encounters between different struggles for social-environmental justice, including those for energy, food (agroecology, food sovereignty), solidarity movements and climate justice. Witnessing the multiple dimensions of violence, (in)justice and geno/ecocide, as well as the visions and practices of enacting eco-social justice. Framed within an intersectional, decolonial lens, drawing connections between injustice and systemic racism, xenophobia, patriarchy, and colonialism, their extractivist dynamics and the production of sacrifice zones and disposable beings. Visibilize connections, collaborations, challenges of the struggles and ways in which researchers can collaborate.*

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**(July 13) Day 3 - Alternative economies**

*Alternative models of the economy that seek to transcend capitalism, including social solidarity economy, cooperativism, mutual aid and self-management, (eco)feminist economy, circular economy, and degrowth. Engagement with organizations practicing these models. Creation of collective solidarity exchange market.*

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#### **(July 14) Day 4 - Commons, commoning and care**

*The commons as an embodiment of new socio-ecological practices and relations based on justice and care for human and non-human others. Reflections with activists engaged in commons-making. Practical exercise on commoning amongst participants.*

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#### **(July 15) Day 5 - Unsettling (eco)citizenship and emancipatory practices**

*An exercise in imagination of emancipatory forms of social engagement, beyond the mainstream conceptions of "citizenship". Discussion of the concept and practices of environmental/eco citizenship, its limitations and its transformative potential. Performing eco-citizenship - insurgent citizenship, autonomous territories, migrants. Reimagining political community and subjects through dissensus: **the** polis which is not the police, which is not extractive. Performing citizenship through an assembly/encounter between the school participants and their invited guests.*
